Bylaw Change

Current:

Upon application, and acceptance, and payment of the prescribed dues, the Association will issue the following classes of membership:

• Active-Annual: Membership may be issued to a commissioned or warrant officer serving in the National Guard. (Dues to be paid annually in accordance with the pay grade: 010=\$168; 09=\$153; 08=\$139; 07=\$123; 06=\$108; 05=\$85; 04=\$72; 03=\$59; 02=\$45; 01=\$30; W5=\$73; W4=\$59; W3=\$46; W2=\$35; W1=\$26.)

Proposed:

Upon application, and acceptance, and payment of the prescribed dues, the Association will issue the following classes of membership:

• Active-Annual: Membership may be issued to a commissioned or warrant officer serving in the National Guard. (Dues to be paid annually in accordance with Company, Field and Flag grade. Company Grade, WO1, CW2, CW3=\$40; Field Grade, CW4, CW5=\$80; Flag Officers=\$130)

The proposed change, if adopted by the membership at the 141st General Conference and Exhibition, would not take place until the 2020 membership year.



Membership Percentage Calculation

- Each state is allocated an annual Officer Strength Objective, which they report to NGAUS
 - NGAUS compares the state reported number to the NGB reported Officer End Strength
 - All active memberships (Complimentary, Active Annual and Active Life) count towards the total membership percentage
 - Retired and associate memberships do not count towards the overall membership percentage.
- Complimentary + Active Annual + Active Life/Strength Objective = Membership Percentage



Rebates and Performance Incentives

Early Bird Rebate

 All <u>Active Annual</u> dues collected, input into the NGAUS database and post-marked to NGAUS by March 31st are eligible for a 5% Early Bird rebate



Rebates and Performance Incentives

- Membership Performance Incentive (formerly 25% Rebate)
 - Any state at or above 50% membership will be eligible for a 25% rebate on all <u>Active Annual</u> and <u>Active Life</u> dues collected, input into the NGAUS database and post-marked to NGAUS by June 30th
 - Any state below 50% that increases its membership percentage by at least 1% will be
 eligible for a 25% rebate on all <u>Active Annual</u> and <u>Active Life</u> dues collected, input into the
 NGAUS database and post-marked to NGAUS by June 30th
 - States below 50% that do not improve their membership year over year will not be eligible for the 25% rebate.

^{*}All states, regardless of their membership percentage will receive 25% rebate on all NGAUS Active Life memberships sold.




iWeb – NGAUS Membership Expiring 2018





Questions



Delegates

To be considered in the delegate strength, memberships must be loaded into the NGAUS Association Management Software (AMS) no later than <u>June 30</u> of each year. The appointment or election of delegates is the function of the state.

The delegate strength for each state is based on the following formula:

- One delegate being the Adjutant General or his designated representative
- One delegate for each 50 members, or major fraction thereof, of the paid Active-Annual or Life, Retired-Separated-Annual, and Retired-Life members
- One delegate who is a Retired-Life member
- Two Company Grade Officers, one Army and one Air
- One Warrant Officer
- Each member of the NGAUS Board of Directors, with the exception of the Adjutant General

Example:

A state with 438 total Active and 420 Retired is entitled to 22 authorized delegates



Committees

Appointed delegates are eligible to serve on various committees and/or caucuses during the conference. The ED from each state designates all committee members during conference registration.

- Committee on Nominations
 - One Army OR One Air
- Committee on Air Resolutions
- Committee on Army Resolutions
- Committee on Joint Resolutions
 - One Army, One Air (to serve on their respective breakouts)
- Area Caucuses
 - One Army, One Air
- Company Grade Caucus
 - One Army, One Air
- Retiree Caucus
 - One Army, One Air
- Warrant Officer Caucus



\$.25 per Guardsman

The payment by the States of twenty-five cents for each enrolled member of the National Guard is a tradition which goes back to the period just before World War I when the NGAUS leadership needed a "war chest" to fight a War Department plan to do away with the Guard.

The custom has continued down through the years. The "state dues" as represented by the twenty-five cents per member program symbolizes the fact that NGAUS represents all of the National Guard; officers, warrant officers, NCOs, enlisted members and families.



Bylaws

Article III, Section 3.01

Upon application, and acceptance, and payment of the prescribed dues, the Association will issue the following classes of membership:

(a) State: Membership may be issued to and in the name of a State. (Dues to be paid annually in the amount of twenty-five cents for each member of the National Guard based on the assigned strength on 30 September of the preceding year as furnished by the National Guard Bureau)





MODERNIZATION OF COUNTERDRUG RC-26B AIRCRAFT

Proposal:

Fully fund and implement a modernized Communications, Navigation, Surveillance / Air Traffic Management (CNS/ATM) Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) 2020-certified avionics solution for all RC-26Bs (Block 20/25R Models)

Recommendation:

The RC-26B fleet (6 x Block 25R + 5 x Block 20) is currently in severe danger of not meeting mission requirements due to an antiquated avionics suite. As of now, NGB has funded only the Block 25R's to receive avionics modernization upgrades, although the Block 25R fleet is still 2 years removed from full implementation & fielding of the upgrades. If the Block 20's are not funded for and implemented with a modernized avionics suite, they will begin to be grounded within the next calendar year due to non-compliance with air worthiness directives. This is based on extensive statistical analysis from the System program Office (SPO) and Contractor Logistics Support (CLS) data. Critical parts are no longer amount and are no longer serviceable for reconditioning. The remainder of the avionics suite is at the end of its service life, does not meet FAA 2020 requirements, and is currently incapable of using GPS as the sole source of navigation. The RC-26B is not worldwide deployable in its present state. Current avionics parts can't be upgraded to meet any of these requirements without wholesale replacement due to age & diminishing manufacturing sources and Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) vendor support. The currently-funded Block 25R avionics suite upgrade IS COMPATIBLE with Block 20's. Additionally, the Block 20's have yet to incorporate the upgraded FLIR 380HD sensor turrets, even though they were purchased in 2013 and interchangeable with the Block 25 aircraft. The FLIR 380HD sensor is a significant increase in capability for the Block 20, with minimal engineering required for fitment.







Overview

- NGAUS Insurance Trust was created in 1963 to make insurance programs available to the technician community.
- The NGAUS Insurance Trust offers Disability Insurance and only Technicians are eligible for this plan.
- Over 10,000 Technicians currently are enrolled in the plan.
- Coverage in 53 states and territories and the District of Columbia



Technician Disability Income Insurance

- National Guard Technicians under the age of 65 are eligible for affordable group rates.
- New hires that apply within their first 31 days of employment are guaranteed acceptance into the plan.
- Basic and Supplemental plans Technician can get up to \$4,500 per month, depending on salary, should they become disabled



Common Causes of Disability

- Accidental injury
- Heart Disease
- Cancer
- Arthritis
- Musculoskeletal Disorders
- Stroke
- Basic disability benefits kick in after 30 consecutive days of disability and continue for up to 10 years for an injury and up to 3 years for sickness.
- Supplemental benefits begin after 60 days (under age 40) and or after 90 days (over age 40) and continue for up to 10 years for an injury and up to 3 years for sickness.
- If over the age of 60, the maximum benefit period is 12 months.



Plan Enhancements

- Expanded salary ranges and benefits for Technicians
- Increased the maximum age from 60 to 65


