Current/Future Notable FY20 NSGAUS Accomplishments

- Early retirement credit for National Guard and Reserve servicemembers under 12046 orders
- Access to TRICARE Reserve Select (TRS) for National employees who serve in the National Guard beginning in 2020, including National Guard dual status technicians
- \$1.2 billion for the National Guard and Reserve Equipment Account (NOREA), includes: > \$295.0 million for the Army National Guard > \$295.0 million for the Air National Guard
- \$1.4 billion for UH-60 Black Hawk M model helicopters for the Army > Consistent with FY20 DoD budget, which requested \$4 M model Black Hawks for the Army National Guard
- \$308.0 million for 4 C-130J Super Hercules aircraft for the Air National Guard
- \$130.0 million for the Army National Guard High Mobility Multi-purpose Wheeled Vehicle (HMMWV) modernization program
- \$75.0 million for F-16 Viper Active Electronically Scanned Array (AESA) radars for the Air National Guard
- \$972.4 million for Joint Light Tactical Vehicles (JLTVs) for the Army > Consistent with FY20 DoD budget, which requested 312 JLTVs for the Army National Guard
- Continued C-130J modernization, includes funding for engine upgrades and propeller replacements
- \$7.3 million for the National Guard preventative mental health program

FY20-FY21 Budget Agreement

President Trump signed a budget agreement into law on 3 August 2019, which set total national defense spending levels at \$758.0 billion for FY20 and \$740.5 billion for FY21 (this agreement
