Frequently Asked Questions

What is NGAUS?

The National Guard Association of the United States (NGAUS) advocates on behalf of the men and women who serve in our National Guard to procure modern equipment and deserved benefits.

How can I get involved with NGAUS advocacy?

Anyone is welcome to use our Write to Congress feature available on the NGAUS website to send a personalized letter to their elected officials to support bills that NGAUS has presented to Congress. ngaus.org/legislation/write-congress

We also have many committees and task forces that our members serve on to help drive the future of Guard advocacy.

Does NGAUS have any events that I can attend?

NGAUS has many events throughout the year including the Legislative Workshop, National Capital Summit, Industry Day, General Conference & Exhibition, and Mental Health Symposium. NGAUS staff also attend many of the conferences held by state National Guard associations.

Who can be a NGAUS member?

Anyone can become a NGAUS member. NGAUS has over 45,000 members from all 50 states, three territories, and the District of Columbia. Our supporters include active, separated, and retired Guardsmen as well as Guard supporters and family members.

What are the benefits of becoming a member?

NGAUS members have access to exclusive professional development opportunities, scholarships, insurance supplements, a monthly subscription to National Guard magazine and

access to articles and legislative analysis. Specific member benefits are based upon member type, visit ngaus.org/membership/member-benefits for details. (A benefits chart can be found on page 5.)

How much does membership cost?

Currently serving Guardsmen have the option of a \$1,000 lifetime membership or annual which is based upon rank. (Pricing can be found on page 5 or on the back of the NGAUS Brochure.)

Recently commissioned Guard officers are eligible to receive a complimentary membership for the year they apply and the full following year.

Retired Guardsmen have the option for a one-time \$125 life membership.

Associates, which include Guard supporters and family members, are eligible for an annual or life membership. Memberships can be purchased for \$45 or \$500 respectively.

What if I can't afford the \$1000 payment for life membership at this time?

Your membership can be paid in \$100 installments over 10 months or \$250 installments every six months over 2 years.

.jpeg File

This version should be used online or in emails, not on printed materials.

.png File

This is a transparent version of the logo and allows for the logo to be used over colored backgrounds, this can be used for smaller printed versions of the logo.

.tif File

This is a large file type and should be used on printed materials.

.eps File

This should be used for very large printed materials such as banners or when the logo becomes pixelated as any other file type.

Membership Retention

The best way to ensure members will renew with your association is to continue engagement with them beyond the initial interactions that lead to membership. We have included email templates in the online resources that will allow you to reach out to your members throughout the year.

Welcome Email: When a new member joins or even when a member renews, thank them for their support. If members have account pages on your website, ask them to make sure their information is correct. You can also ask some questions to get to know them, this lets you understand who your members are and it also gives insight into what your members might be looking to get from the association.

Onboarding Emails: These can be multiple emails that follow the initial welcome email. These emails are meant to give members information and keep them engaged with the association. You can send a different email every few weeks that touches on different aspects of the association: events, benefits, legislation, how to get involved or volunteer, etc.

Renewal Emails: Reach out to expiring members beginning in October when their membership can count toward the following year. We suggest giving them examples of any accomplishments your association had throughout the year. Members want to know that their dues are going toward something that benefits them.
