



Key Legislation

H.R.4221 – Healthcare for our Troops Act

Provides zero-cost TRICARE Reserve Select for all members of the Reserve Component.

S.2046/H.R.4220 – Dental Care for Our Troops Act

Provides zero-cost Dental Care for all members of the Reserve Component.

H.R.3392 – Fighter Force Preservation and Recapitalization Act of 2023

Supports and strengthens the fighter aircraft capabilities of the Air Force and Air National Guard.

H.R.5112/S.503 – Space National Guard Establishment Act

Establishes the Space National Guard as the Primary Combat Reserve of the USSF

H.R. 2935/S. 1755 – Sergeant First Class Michael Clark TRICARE Reserve Parity Act

• Expands TRICARE eligibility for surviving family members upon death of a servicemember to three years – bringing parity for Reserve Component benefits to that of active-duty personnel.

H.R.2597/S.1095 – Reserve Component Parental Leave Parity Act

• Aligns National Guard and Reserve parental leave eligibility with active-duty standards leave eligibility to include both parents welcoming a new child into their lives, through either birth, adoption, or long-term foster care.

H.R.3267/S.456 – COMFORT Act

Provides license reciprocity for non-medical mental and behavioral health counselors.

H.R.6225 – Expanding Home Loans for Guard and Reservists Act

Expands eligibility for a housing loan guaranteed by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to certain individuals who performed active duty for training.

Legislative Update - Recap

FY24 President's Budget

President's Budget - Requested \$886.0 Billion in total defense spending

- \$842.0B requested for the Department of Defense
- Released March 9, 2023

FY24 Authorizations

National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2024

- Signed into law by the President on December 22, 2023
- Authorized \$866B for the Total National Defense Topline, including \$842B for DOD topline; matching the President's Budget request

FY24 Appropriations

S. 4633 – Fiscal 2024 Defense Appropriations

- Provides \$831.8B appropriated to DOD
- \$850M for NGREA, with \$278.1M for the ARNG and \$255.1M for the ANG

H.R.4365 – Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2024

- \$826.45B appropriated to DOD
- \$1.0for NGREA, with \$312M for the ARNG and \$305M for the ANG

Continuing Resolutions

- MILCON expires 15 January 2024
- Defense Appropriations expires 1 February 2024



Resolution Types

Standing

Resolutions previously passed at a NGAUS Conference

Draft

- Proposed additions, changes or deletions to Standing Resolutions
 - Due 1 July
 - Require 51% + vote to pass

Emergency

- Allowed if circumstances arise beyond the control of sponsoring state
 - Requires notification of NGAUS
 - Due between 1 July and 31 July
 - Require 75% + vote to pass



Co-Sponsoring Resolutions

Process

Submit a request to Aubrey Powers via email at resolutions@ngaus.org

Guidelines

- Request must come from State Association President, Executive Director, or Resolutions Chair
- States can only request to co-sponsor Draft Resolutions for themselves
- Co-sponsor requests may be submitted at any time after a Draft Resolution has been submitted to NGAUS and before the NGAUS Conference

- Prepare to speak in support of Draft Resolutions sponsored and cosponsored by your state
- Review Resolutions

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

Key Legislation

H.R.3048/S.503 – to Establish a Space National Guard/Space National Guard Establishment Act

Establishes the Space National Guard as the Primary Combat Reserve of the USSF

H.R.3267 – COMFORT Act

 Authorizes the provision of non-medical counseling services to a member of the Armed Forces, or a dependent of such member, by a mental health professional

NGAUS is actively seeking to have all legislation mentioned below reintroduced in the 118th Congress

Healthcare for our Troops Act

- Provides Zero-Cost TRICARE Reserve Select and dental coverage for all members of the RC
- Authorizes TRS eligibility for RC servicemembers who are federal employees in their civilian capacity

Guard and Reserve GI Bill Parity Act

Provides GI Bill education benefits parity between the Active and Reserve Components

RECRUIT Act

Authorizes small businesses tax credits for employing members of the Guard and Reserves



Legislative Update - Recap

FY24 President's Budget

President's Budget - Requested \$886.0 Billion in total defense spending

- \$842.0 Billion requested for the Department of Defense
- Released March 9, 2023

FY24 Authorizations

H.R.2670 – National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2024

- Sent to the House floor on June 21, 2023
- Authorized \$874.2 Billion Total National Defense Topline, including: \$841.5 Billion for DOD topline and \$400 Million for defense-related activities outside NDAA jurisdiction


FY24 Appropriations

H.R.4365 – Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2024

- Sent to the House floor on June 22, 2023
- \$826.45 Billion appropriated to DOD, \$285.87 Million over the President's Request
- \$1.0 Billion is for NGREA, with \$312 Million designated for the ARNG and \$305 Million for the ANG

Outlook: The FY24 NDAA and Appropriations bills have cleared their respective committees in the House, but the Senate bills have not been released.

Overview

- NGAUS Insurance Trust was created in 1963 to make insurance programs available to the technician community.
- The NGAUS Insurance Trust offers Disability Insurance and only Technicians and Title 5 National Guard employees are eligible for this plan.
- About 4,500 are currently are enrolled in the plan.
- Coverage in all 50 states, territories and the District of Columbia



Technician Disability Income Insurance

 National Guard Technicians and Title 5 employees under the age of 65 are eligible for affordable group rates.

 All new hires receive <u>NO COST</u> coverage for the first year, with guaranteed acceptance, that apply within their first 31 days of employment

 Basic and Supplemental plans – Technicians can get up to \$6,000 per month, depending on salary, should they become disabled



Common Causes of Disability

- Accidental injury
- Heart Disease
- Cancer
- Arthritis
- Musculoskeletal Disorders
- Stroke
- Basic disability benefits kick in after 30 consecutive days of disability and continue for up to 10 years for an injury and up to 3 years for sickness.
- Supplemental benefits begin after 60 days (under age 40) and or after 90 days (over age 40) and continue for up to 10 years for an injury and up to 3 years for sickness.
- If over the age of 60, the maximum benefit period is 12 months.



Plan Enhancements

• Expanded salary ranges and benefits for Technicians and Title 5's

• Increased the maximum age from 60 to 65




Finding a Profile

- Select Modules, select CRM
- In the left navigation under Individuals, select "Find Individuals".
- Always search for an individual profile before creating a new profile. They may already have an existing profile within the database that needs to be updated.
 - If you suspect the individual was previously affiliated with a different state, contact NGAUS before adding a new profile.
- Use "%" at the beginning and ending of a name to broaden the search criteria.
 - Example searching for Thomas Smith
 - Last Name "%Smith%"
 - First Name use "T%
 - This will result in those with a last name of Smith and all first names that contain a T.







- Update profile address under Demographics
- Profiles are placed on hold when mail is returned to NGAUS, or when we receive notice from USPS as a bad address.
- The member will receive an email to updated their profile when the address is placed on hold.
 - This is why it is important to have a valid email on file.
- Holds will be removed when the address is updated.




Batches


- What is a batch?
 - A batch is a collection or group of accounting transactions sorted by a number or code that are reconciled at a later time. In the simplest description, NetForum batches are just "buckets" used for transporting ledger entries from NetForum to NGAUS accounting software.
- Batches are found in the Accounting module.
















Batches
